The *Tennessee Wolverines* are a Nashville-based nonprofit dedicated to developing a fun, competitive, and affordable girls' travel hockey program. Sanctioned by the Southern Amateur Hockey Association under USA Hockey's Southeast District, our *mission* is to *remove barriers that prevent girls from participating in ice hockey while fostering a love for the game.*

Beyond hockey, the Wolverines instill core values such as **hard work, teamwork,** and **respect,** helping our student-athletes grow both on and off the ice. Our program offers a variety of opportunities, from learn-to-skate and introductory hockey sessions to advanced skill development programs tailored to help players reach their full potential.

The **Tennessee Wolverines** were founded in 2022 by a group of determined female hockey players from the **Brentwood Academy** Junior Varsity team. This group of girls simply wanted "more ice". Through the relentless recruiting efforts of the original members and teaming up with members of the **Harpeth Hall** Junior Varsity team, the first Wolverines group was formed with 26 members.

Over the next two seasons, the Tennessee Wolverines cultivated an inclusive environment that welcomes and encourages all developing female hockey players to PLAY.

SEASON DATES

The Tennessee Wolverines 2025-2026 season runs from August 2025 through March 2026.

GAME SCHEDULES & TRAVEL

Game schedules will vary by age level with the older teams participating in fewer game weekends to allow the girls to participate in scholastic leagues within Nashville and the Middle Tennessee area.

- 8U: TBD
- 10U: 8-10 weekends
- 12U: 8-10 weekends
- 14U: 10-12 weekends
- 16U: 8-10 weekends
- 19U: 8-10 weekends

All Wolverines teams will be participating in the Central Girls Hockey League (CGHL), a Tier-II, girls hockey league based in the central United States with teams located in Indiana, Missouri, Ohio and Tennessee.

To help keep the costs lower for our families, the Wolverines aim to keep the bulk of their travel destinations within driving distances. Along with playing most of their games on Saturdays and Sundays ONLY to keep the total amount of school missed by our players to a minimum throughout the hockey season.
